Key Responsibilities:

The key responsibility of the Casual Lecturer in Leather Craft is to continue the teaching and assessing of the College for saddlery and/or shoemaking courses, conducting student tutorials, providing specialised advice and supporting curriculum development. They must maintain and contribute to the quality of service and promote a safe and healthy working environment in accordance with the College's policies.

Responsibilities:

1. Saddlery and/or shoemaking to appropriate examination body standards, including both center and work-based learning
2. Carrying out tutorials with students, recording results and providing management information
3. Providing specialist advice relating to animal care activities and developments
4. Supporting curriculum planning, development and support within the Department
5. Researching and the production of course materials
6. Liaising with internal staff with regard to the provision of practical student activities
7. Liaising with external bodies, visiting speakers and representatives within the industry
8. Ensuring that all requirements and regulations relating to health and safety are adhered to at all times
9. Responsible for ensuring that the health and safety of students is maintained whilst undertaking practical sessions
10. Providing specialist input into the development of new courses, modules, services or activities within the college
11. Any other duties of a similar nature as required by the Director of Animal Management & Saddlery

General Responsibilities:

1. Promote and implement all College policies, particularly those which refer to health & safety, equality of opportunity and Safeguarding young people and vulnerable adults
2. Participate in College programmes of staff appraisal and continuing professional development
3. Develop effective working relationships internally and with external partners
4. To operate at all times in line with the College's values and behaviours
5. Undertake other duties as may reasonably be required in the interests of the efficient functioning of the College

Qualifications

- Possess a Level 2 qualification in English and Maths or a willingness to achieve within a specified period
- Saddlery and/or shoemaking qualification desirable
- A teaching qualification is desirable

Experience

- A background in the leathercraft industry (saddlery and/or shoemaking).
- Experience of demonstrating practical skills and teaching underpinning knowledge relating to saddlery/shoemaking for the education of students and public
- Experience of teaching and assessing in a College or training environment would be advantageous but is not essential

- Knowledge on saddlery, leathercraft and/ or shoemaking

- Experience in being adaptable in working in different working environments and teams

- Familiarity with Information Learning Technology applications and an active interest in use of ILT to improve access to learning
